We are thrilled that our social clubs have started their events up again. Our staff has been working with them to promote their events and make sure the facilities are ready.


Some highlights:

possible to avoid playing with a weaker partner, especially when they're playing against a strong team. If we lived in a perfect world we could always play with our favorite and best partner, but we all know invariably something gets in the way of that happening. Sometimes, we just have to play with whoever is available and sometimes that person is weaker than we are. I embrace playing with a weaker partner, especially in practice matches. I find the benefits to be many and the downsides to be few. Here are my reasons. Our goal is to help you enjoy and gain from all your match experiences, not just the perfect ones. Most of the athletes we idolize are people who take others (teammates) and elevate them to a championship level. Michael Jordan did not have 10 all Stars with him nor did Kobe Bryant. Tom Brady can make anyone look good on the field, even players playing new positions. The next time you play with a weaker doubles partner, see if you can play your best tennis by stepping up at big moments. Did Michael Jordan make a weaker player take the game winning shot? Never. Obviously in tennis you can't take all the shots, but you will have a chance to neutralize any weaknesses your partner has. If your partner is missing returns you don't miss any. If you do not lose a point on your returns your partner only needs one time to break. You're making them do a reasonable share of the work. If they're struggling to hold serve, be more aggressive at the net to help them and make sure you always hold serve. Allow yourself to raise your level of play to where it needs to be. The biggest thing that limits your play isn't your shots it's your thoughts. Understand, accept and embrace the challenge and face it head on with excitement and enthusiasm. You are going to get a chance today to show your best because you must. Every match and practice up to this point have prepared you for this match. Go for it. The other way great athletes succeed regardless of their partners is that they create a safe environment for them to play their best. There are several key things you need to help get everything you can out of a weaker partner or any partner for that matter. Be excited about playing with them. Let them feel it. Show them your support

WHAT TO BE AWARE OF THIS WINTER DEALING WITH THE CORONAVIRUS

The high, high crests of delta transmission are subsiding in some parts of the country, as they have in countries where delta took off before it did in the U.S.

Some health experts say that by the end of November, the delta wave will have waned and new cases will be down "at quite a low level." How low? Down to where the country was in late June and early July, before delta took off. At that point the country was reporting somewhere between 7,500 to 15,000 new cases most days.

It sounds very optimistic, doesn't it? We're probably going to stay there, because there is quite a bit of immunity in the population. That heartening prediction comes with a big but. That assumes that no new variant comes in. Because if you get a new variant that either has a higher transmissible rate or immune escape potential, then we will see resurgence.

Late November coincides with Thanksgiving, America's favorite week for cross-country travel. Last year, Thanksgiving and Christmas turbo-charged COVID spread. But there is a strong chance that transmission levels can remain low if large family gatherings occur across the nation this year.

A group of health leaders feel that it will become a seasonal respiratory disease, but it will be the worst of our seasonal respiratory diseases. They say that something that circulates at three times the level of flu and has a similar infection fatality rate to flu possibly causes three times flu's deaths every year."

Other health people voiced some optimism. Many of us may be fed up with COVID restrictions, but we have learned that respiratory illnesses don't have to be inevitable features of winter. In the face of surges of virus, we are finding more ways to protect ourselves. Getting vaccinated is of primary importance. And, of course, always consult your primary physician.

handlers of the canine unit, with their dogs. The dogs provide many benefits to victims of domestic violence and other crimes. They provide a welcome distraction to chaotic situations arising in the home. It has been shown that when children have an opportunity to read to the attentive, non-judgement dogs in a program called Read Along, their reading levels have increased. The therapy dogs are helpful at accidents and are trained to sit in a witness box at trial to calm the testifier!

PBC School Board member Karen Brill informed the group that Mike Burke was made the permanent Superintendent of PBC Schools. Because of lower numbers in the transmission of Covid 19, a policy of optional masking has been implemented in the schools. Ms. Brill also described some of the school board meetings lately, at which the public scream and threaten the board members!

Members of the Palm Beach County Fire Rescue (PBCFR) team were introduced including Fire Chief Reggie Duren. PBFR's Community Education Director discussed the change from battery operated house fire alarms to alarms that do not require changing the batteries. The audience was cautioned on careless cooking which is responsible for the majority of home

fires. Pots left burning on the stove or using the oven for storage of household items are two contributing factors. Please store your clothing and shoes elsewhere! No Joke. When cooking, if you leave the kitchen, keep a spoon in hand as a reminder that something is on the stove cooking.



THE HEALTH ROOM

Flu season is here again, and those virus infections will overlap with the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, creating the possibility of a "twindemic" of two distinct, dangerous illnesses that cause (among other things) respiratory distress, hospitalizations and death for millions of people. Nationwide lockdowns that kept people distanced, mixed with the annual flu shot, largely helped dodge the double blast of infections last year. But this year, things are different. Many other viruses, like RSV and rhinovirus, are coming back. And the flu likely will follow as a steep rise in coronavirus infection.

While the US saw last winter, a spread of influenza that was uncommonly light, this year could return to the typical pattern, in which millions of people in the US catch the influenza virus. With COVID-19 vaccines and booster shots now authorized — even mix-and-match shots—intermingling is expected. (And, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, are on the way.) And with that, a possible increase in the flu, alongside new waves of delta variant COVID infections at a time when peoples' stance on masking and social distancing have become political issues, not just public health concerns.

As with the COVID-19 vaccines, the flu shot is not 100% effective in guarding against infection. But like the coronavirus shots, the flu vaccine can blunt the severity of the virus if you do catch it. The CDC said getting vaccinated for flu can reduce the risk of having to go to the doctor 40% to 60%.

And don't worry about more serious side effects with a four-part flu vaccine: Whether the vaccine is made using three components or four, the side effects should be the same.

Expect to book an appointment to get your flu shot

If you're used to walking up to your local pharmacy, hospital or clinic to get a flu shot whenever it's most convenient to you, you may find this year that you have to schedule an appointment instead.

Signs in a local pharmacy instruct customers to make an appointment for both flu and COVID vaccinations online.

It's safe to get your COVID and flu shots simultaneously.

The COVID pandemic continues to cause infection,

hospitalization and death, with hospitals in the hardesthit areas once again at the limit of their ability to treat patients. But the flu shot should be as easy to get as the COVID-19 vaccination.

In fact, the CDC has said it's safe to get a flu shot and COVID vaccination in the same sitting. (Vaccine-maker Moderna said it's working on a combination COVID-19/flu vaccine, but that combo won't be available this year.)


On February 11 be sure to wear your favorite team jersey to our Sports Night at the Westchester Country Club. Dinner, dancing and a good time is sure to be had by all.

The ceremony was then closed and light refreshments were offered.




