We would like to offer some recent updates as we continue to work with our new management company as well as some safety messages.



Pest and Rodent Control - A new company, All Florida Pest Control, has been hired effective February 1 to do all exterior pest control as well as rodent control. This contract is estimated to save up to \$20,000 from our expenses for these items in 2020. Instead of being reactive to calls for pest control, each building will be sprayed for pests once per month. We are also investigating a proactive approach anticipating the ground breaking of 13th floor and the disturbance of rodents that have settled on the old golf course.

Landscaping - Work has begun to spruce up the main entrance off of Via Delray. You should see noticeable improvement already. The entrances off of El Clair are receiving some refreshing as well. Sadly, we already had some theft of flowers and bushes in our main entrance so we ask everyone to report any suspicious activity. We have also cleaned our walkways to remove mold and keep our sidewalks safe for walking.

Parking - On a monthly basis the maintenance staff will be doing an audit for parking violations including residents with no parking stickers, visitors with no hang tags in visitor parking spots and vehicles backed into parking spots. You can get resident stickers and visitor hang tags at the office. If you have a regular aide coming in, the office will provide a sticker. We remain vigilant in trying to protect our community from visitors who are not registered to be here, yet welcoming to those who live or provide services.

Roof replacements - Due to a number of roofs with shingles not lasting as long as anticipated, an upgraded shingle has been approved and has been installed on two units to date, in Fishtail and Sentry. Our plan going forward is to use the upgraded shingles for future roof replacements. We are also getting quotes to clean the many moldy roofs in our community.

Speeding on Palm Greens Way - continues to be a problem. If the trend continues, additional speed bumps may be the only solution. Please slow down.

Safety Message - Please remember to clean your clothes dryer lint filter after every run. The cleaning of dryer vents is the owner's responsibility. The fire extinguishers in your outside area are checked annually but as an extra safety measure, an ABC fire extinguisher in your condo would provide another layer of protection.

FROM THE MANAGING EDITOR

On January 19 and February 16, I received my vaccinations of the Coronavirus vaccine at the VA Medical



Center in West Palm Beach. The following is a short description of my experience at the Center over the two dates.

The VA Medical Center is located at 7305 N Military Trail, (561) 422-8262. In late December, the VA Medical Center got its first shipment of vaccines. Since then, they have vaccinated more than 11,000, including veterans over 70 and health care workers.

January 19 – The area for the vaccinations is located off Military Trail and you have to be very attentive to where you make your left turn (if you are driving North) so you get into the big parking lot. You will see three large tents and there will be people to guide you once you get on the line. Note: If you have not registered with the VA you MUST have a copy of your discharge papers. The area is basically set up with three tents. One for filling out forms if you are not registered with the VA, one for getting signed in to the area for the vaccinations and one for where the vaccinations are given. That's it. You will be virtually surrounded by people who will guide you through the system. After you have gone through the first two tents, you will enter the third tent and get your shot. You will then be given a card that verifies your first shot and has a date for your second shot. You will sit in that tent for about 10-15 minutes and released. Note: If you are registering for the first time you will be sent to the VA hospital to take a photo for your official registration. The hospital is a short distance from the vaccination area. After you take your photo, you can go home. I will not cover the after-effects of the shot since they will vary from person to person

February 16 – I arrived at 10am for my second shot. The longest line is alongside the parking lot, which is where you check in.

Once I checked in I went into the vaccination tent to await my call and five minutes later I was called in. The shot took under 10 minutes and the post-shot wait was under 5 minutes. I was then dismissed and I went home at 11am. That is it.

As the new Clerk of Circuit Court and Comptroller believes in happy employees, he spent 10 to 20 minutes with each employee, listening to their ideas and getting to know them. His office will perform over 1000 duties setting a new course for the office. In the first 30 days, the office raised the minimum wage for the employees to \$15/hour, and created an office for the first employee ombudsman position who will investigate citizens' complaints, and finalizing a brand new website with a service finder to get what you need without visiting the office!

You can pay traffic tickets or other services and see how your money is being spent by logging to the site. Once you register you will receive e-mails or phone alerts if anything is filed in your name with this office. You can sign up at www.mypalmbeachclerk.com/selfservice. You will learn more by going to this website. There are passport services, appointment only. It will protect you from abuse, guardianship issues



WHAT TO DO WHEN YOUR PRINTER DOESN'T PRINT

If it hasn't happened already, there will come a time in your life when your printer just will not print. Here are eight tips to help you troubleshoot your printer.

- 1) Look for an error or warning light on the printer and your computer. Refer to the manual about what the warning lights indicate.
- 2) Look for any paper jams. Be aware that some printers have multiple locations to look for paper jams most have a back door.
- 3) Make sure there is enough paper in the tray and the tray is fully pushed in place.
- 4) Sometimes old documents that failed to print can hold up the printing so cancel any pending print jobs.
- 5) Check the ink/toner cartridges are not empty. If you haven't printed for over a month, inks could have dried. Try cleaning them using the printer's built-in maintenance menu or the printer's program on your computer.
- 6) Check for loose cables the cables to the printer should be snuggly plugged in on both ends.
- 7) If you have a Wi-Fi printer, use the USB cable instead to isolate any issues with your Wi-Fi. If you still prefer to use Wi-Fi, re-connect it to the same Wi-Fi network as your computer.
 - 8) Restart the printer and computer.






HE SAID...SHE SAID



You know this is true...at one time or another, we all "kvetch" about getting old. But let's take a more positive look at this and maybe we will appreciate some of the perks we get as seniors.

Here's how getting older can save you money:

- · Senior discounts.
- Travel deals
- Tax deductions for seniors.
- Bigger retirement account limits.
- No more early withdrawal penalty.
- Social Security payments.
- Affordable health insurance.
- Senior services.
- Free college.

Senior Discounts

If you're willing to admit your age, you may be able to get a discount on your next restaurant meal or retail purchase. Many museums, movie theaters and entertainment venues provide reduced admission prices to people who are above a certain age.

AARP negotiates discounts for members, who can join as early as age 50, often allowing you to start using senior discounts at a younger age. Discounts are sometimes available on necessities such as groceries and clothing. Not all senior discounts are publicized, and sometimes they are given only to those who request them and show proof of age.

Travel Deals

Many hotels and rental car companies will provide a discount to seniors who are above a certain age or AARP members. Travelers are eligible for 10% off some Amtrak fares at age 65 and older and 5% off Greyhound bus tickets beginning at age 62. Citizens age 62 and older can get a National Park Service lifetime senior pass to over 2,000 federal recreation sites for just \$80 in person (\$90 online or via mail).

Tax Deductions for Seniors

People age 65 and older are eligible for several extra tax deductions. Seniors are eligible to claim a bigger standard deduction than younger taxpayers. The standard deduction is \$1,300 more for each spouse who is age 65 or older or \$2,600 if both members of a married couple meet the age requirement.

POINTS OF INTEREST

Since I've taken you across Florida from East to West, I thought we should visit what has to be an outstanding exhibition venue, one where you can spend hours in peace and tranquility, a place that will stay with you long after you have gone home.

The Morikami Museum and Japanese Gardens -4000 Morikami Park Rd, Delray Beach - (561) 495-0233. This center for Japanese arts and culture is located a brief 5-10 minute drive off Jog Road.

In 1904, Jo Sakai, a recent graduate of New York University, returned to his homeland of Miyazu, Japan, to organize a group of pioneering farmers and lead them to what is now northern Boca Raton. With the help of the Model Land Company, a subsidiary of Henry Flagler's East Coast Railroad, they formed a farming colony they named Yamato, an ancient name for Japan. By the 1920s the community, which had never grown beyond 30 to 35 individuals, finally surrendered its dream. One by one, the families left for other parts of the United States.

The Museum - The original building, named the Yamato-kan, is modeled after a Japanese villa. It features a ring of exhibition rooms surrounding an open-air courtyard with a dry garden of gravel, pebbles and small boulders. The Yamato-kan offers a permanent exhibit chronicling the history of the Yamato Colony.

The principal museum building opened in 1993 to meet popular demand for more programming, more versatile facilities, and to satisfy the needs of a growing community. The museum's architecture is inspired by traditional Japanese design. The building features three exhibition galleries, a 225-seat theater, an authentic tea house with viewing gallery, classrooms, a museum store, the Cornell Cafe and lakeside terraces for a panoramic view while dining.

The Morikami Collections house more than 7,000 Japanese art objects and artifacts, including a 500-piece collection of tea ceremony items, more than 200 textile pieces and fine art acquisitions.

The Gardens - The 16 acres that surround Morikami's two museum buildings include expansive Japanese gardens with strolling paths, resting areas, a world-class bonsai collection and lakes teeming with koi and other wildlife. The wider 200-acre park features nature trails, pine forests and picnic areas.

In 2001, Morikami completed a major garden expansion and renovation. The new gardens reflect major periods of Japanese garden design, from the eighth to the 20th century, and serve as an outdoor extension of the museum. According to the garden designer, Hoichi Kurisu, each garden is intended to express the character and ideas of a unique counterpart in Japan without attempting to duplicate those gardens, and seamlessly flow together as one garden.

Morikami Museum and Japanese Gardens, with its unique gardens and collections, is one of Palm Beach County's most treasured cultural attractions. Located in a tranquil natural setting, Morikami invites visitors to explore its many facets and discover Florida's heritage and its connection with Japan.

Daily Admission - Adults (ages 18+): \$15 - Seniors (65+) \$13 - Children (ages 6-17): \$9, Children 5 and under: FREE! Following social distancing guidelines, you will find some things have changed at Morikami...

- All visitors will be required to wait outside before entering the lobby, and the majority of your visit will be an outdoor experience.
- We suggest wearing sunscreen, bringing plenty of water and an umbrella to protect you from both the sun and summer rain.
 - Once you arrive, please follow signage directing you to either the "General Admission" or "Member Admission" line.
 - To ensure a safe experience only credit and debit cards will be accepted.
 - Check out the self-guided audio tour at www.morikami.org/tour.
 - The Seishin-an Tea House and Yamato-kan are temporarily closed to visitors.
- The Cornell Cafe will be serving from a limited menu, using disposable containers and utensils. Seating will be limited and only available on the outdoor terrace on a first come, first served basis.
 - The **Morikami Museum Store** will be open regular operating hours from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm.
 - Please familiarize yourself with our Health & Safety Guidelines before your visit.

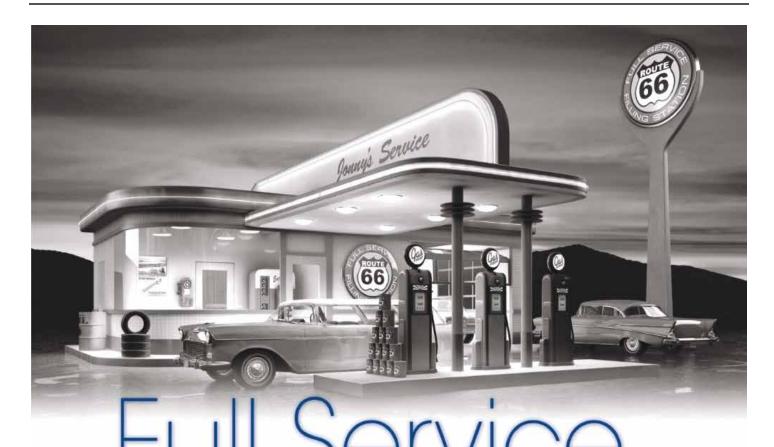



and fraud. Another service is a self-service center in the main courthouse. You can get help on how to work through courts without a lawyer. Also, user-friendly notary service.

Mr. Abruzzo said to contact his office if there were any questions. "Chief" Joe, as he likes to be called, believes in diversity at work and has hired people from many backgrounds...Jewish, African-American, the Islands, Spanish. All have strong positions in his administration. Very open-minded and caring! His office covers public records, passports, traffic tickets, jury-duty to name a few. Visit the website.

Our executive V.P. Dr. Lori Vinkoor, brought us up to date on the work being done between Lyons Road and Rte 441. Less gas taxes have been collected this year due to COVID, and the taxes fund roadway projects so this project is being postponed until Fiscal Year 2024.

Lieutenant Morales from District 4 spoke about the increase in traffic because of the snowbirds. Yes, many have come down for the season. There has been an 18% increase in traffic accidents. He advised everyone to leave home 15 minutes earlier when traveling, for safety sake. We should all slow down and not get distracted when driving. A small increase in speed leads to deadly crashes! At the South County Civic Center, you must have an appointment to receive the vaccine. Teachers and those over 65 years old are eligible. Go to the website myvaccine.fl.gov for statewide signup.

Emily Slosberg, is trying to organize programs (PODS) in our 55+ communities. There is also a new bill on the pandemic to comply with Florida Legislature regarding selling vaccines. She is also working on traffic safety and issues about texting while driving.

- 1) The vaccine doesn't guarantee complete immunity and it takes a couple of weeks after the 2nd dose for your body to produce antibodies.

- 3) We won't achieve "herd immunity" until 60-70% or more of the population is vaccinated.

penalty to withdraw money from your IRA. And if you leave your job at age 55 or later, you can begin taking penalty-free 401(k) withdrawals from the account associated with the job you left at an even earlier age.

Social Security Payments

You can sign up for reduced Social Security payments as early as age 62 or claim the full amount you have earned at your full retirement age of 66 or 67, depending on your birth year. If you delay claiming your payments past your full retirement age up until age 70, you will earn delayed retirement credits that will further boost your monthly benefit. The later you start, the higher your benefit. These payments are adjusted for inflation each year and will continue for as long as you live.

Senior Services

Many communities provide low-cost taxi or van services to help seniors citizens get to doctor appointments or go grocery shopping. Some cities even provide free or discounted public transportation to people above a certain age. Senior centers might provide low-cost meals, affordable classes and entertainment and an opportunity to socialize with other seniors. Your local library or community center might also have events specifically for older residents.

Free College

College costs are a major expense for young people. But retirees might be able to take classes for free or at a very low cost. Many public colleges and some private institutions provide senior citizen tuition waivers or allow older people to audit classes for free or a minimal cost on a space-available basis. And there are over 100 Osher Lifelong Learning Institutes on college campuses that offer affordable classes specifically for retirees.

Bottom line: Enjoy the life you are living and appreciate what the rest of your life has to offer. It's a good way to start each day.




TOP TIPS FOR HEALTHIER MASK WEARING!
