Welcome Back. This past year has been a personal challenge for everyone with Covid de-fining our social lives, travel and ability to enjoy retirement as



we had hoped. Our Board has also been challenged with decisions on how best to safely open our facilities, balance our finances and improve our community's appearance and internal processes.

We would like to share some good news with you. We are on the road to successfully accomplishing our 2021 goals established at the beginning of this year. Our special assessment was approved, an outside vendor (the same as Condo 1) completed our long-range reserve study, our first ever electronic voting will be available at our annual meeting, a structural contract was signed and 17 buildings needing steel beam work are in process, all of our roofs are now clean, and a new sprinkler system is being installed.

We need everyone's help going forward.

- Please sign up to vote electronically as we only have approximately 100-unit owners out of 717 ready to vote with this easy and secure method. Applications are on our resident portal.
- Please VOTE. We will be sending out a voting proxy that will now occur annually and we need a majority (359) of our owners to vote. We will be asking you to vote for PARTIAL funding of our reserves this year. This will keep our maintenance fee at a reasonable amount. If this does not pass, we will be forced by law to fully fund our reserves at an unreasonable monthly maintenance fee.

That said, here's an update we'd like to share.


- Unlike a year ago the Pool, Clubhouse, Tennis, Cafe and other amenities are all open, albeit with loosened yet some reasonable restrictions.





ALLIANCE OF DELRAY RESIDENTIAL ASSOCIATIONS

Our main topic at our Zoom meeting was Looking Forward to the 2022 Legislative Session. Panelists included Sen. Lori Berman, Rep. Kelly Skidmore, Victoria Nolan, Exec Dir. Of Legislative Delegation and Ed Chase, Director of Intergovernmental Affairs.

A panel discussion about the 2022 Legislative Session followed. State Senator Lori Berman had a number of bills presented, but because of the raging Covid numbers in her area she presented a bill to the Senate to allow for Home Rule so that PBC could provide safety regulations. She is also attempting to undo the bill that prohibits masking and vaccination requirements for private enterprises. Sen. Berman is also working to strengthen the Hate Crime statue, curb human trafficking (a big problem here in Florida) and create a statewide Department of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Office. If a person is convicted of Domestic Violence, they should not have access to guns! Her office is at I95 and Gateway.

Representative Kelly Skidmore said that following census findings, new districts are being drawn up. Some new bills are being discussed. They include waivers for people in recovery being able to continue their education and establishing a Gift of Life registry for people willing to donate their bone marrow. She ended with this advice: Have questions about treatments? Speak to doctors. They are a platform for good information.

Victoria Nolan, Executive Director of the PBC legislation Delegation announced the many dates that new legislation will be considered.

Ed Chase, PBC Director of Intergovernmental Affairs, discussed the need for affordable housing in the

TIPS FROM OUR TENNIS PRO

by Jim Boardman (USTPA Pro)

Tips for mastering the art of tennis.

Accept the strokes you have now and learn to maximize your strengths and minimize your weaknesses, rather than constantly changing your strokes. Practice shots for situations rather than in a vacuum (touch, angled, volley). Serve to three spots (wide, body, T]. Three returns (short angle low, lob, hard at net person). Play a ton of points in different situations [server vs receiver one on one 1\2 court, server vs receiver and partner, receiver vs server and partner. All four players work on different scenarios, serve and volley, and be able to handle all returns. Practice the three most important returns in the game situations [s.a.l] short, angle, low, offensive lob, and hard at net person. Work on different score situations. For example, you are serving 5 to 4 in the second set, having lost the first set. What should a team be thinking? What shots will be the most effective for both teams? Work on handling whatever happens during a match, by remaining relaxed and stay in the moment. The only point you can win is the one you are playing now [stay present]. Work on accepting whatever conditions you're in and not letting them upset you. Rather find a solution since you will eventually have to for all situations in real matches. It's windy, it's sunny, I'm playing poorly, my partner is playing poorly, our opponents are playing out of their minds, we got off to a bad start, and are down. Most importantly, get great at the first 2 shots of every point, that will always include either serve or return. If you can be consistently solid early in the point, hit good set Up shots and let the point end itself everyone will want to be your partner, and no one will want to play against you.



Remember you miss 100% of your shots you don't take.
